Enable us, O Lord that the direction of this School may always be in the hands of those who believe that man is guided by the Holy Spirit to live according to thy revelation.

Abide with us, O Risen Christ.

Grant, Almighty God, that the purpose wherewith thou hast called this Building to its present state and structure may be fulfilled in its future work and thy life continually renewed in those who teach and those who are taught here in thy name. Prosper with thy blessing the work of this school which we dedicate to the training of youth in thy service. Put it into the hearts of all, both masters and students, that they set thy will ever before themselves and do always such things as please thee, that so both the Church and Nation may be blessed through them and they themselves attain unto everlasting life: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let godly fellowship here abound, O Lord, and so lead thy servants in their several occupations that they may walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time to the perfecting of their lives and the glory of thy blessed name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Procession will mount to the Second Floor singing Hymn 530

On, then, Christian soldiers,

Give us light in the night season, we beseech thee, O Lord, and grant that our rest may be without sin, and our waking to thy service: that we may come in peace and safety to the waking of the great day: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Procession shall march down the stairs, singing Hymn 268, into the Cloister, where the Bishop shall say:

IN THE FAITH OF JESUS CHRIST, I, PHILIP COOK, BY DIVINE PERMISSION BISHOP OF DELAWARE, DEDICATE THIS BUILDING TO THE GLORY OF GOD THROUGH THE TRAINING OF YOUTH AND IN MEMORY OF THE BLESSED APOSTLE ST. ANDREW. IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY GHOST. AMEN.

O merciful God, who hast put it into the hearts of certain of thy servants to build this School to thy Glory and for the sound learning of thy children; bless all whose bounteous gifts have been bestowed upon this place, and especially the Founder, Donors, and Trustees of St. Andrew's. Keep this School faithful to the trust that they have placed in it, that their reward may be great and the harvest of their faith a rich one, through the might of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
