A Note about this Service

In 1880 the Bishop of Truro, England, drew up a Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols, based on ancient sources, for use on Christmas Eve in the wooden shed which served as his cathedral. In 1918 the Dean of King's College, Cambridge, Eric Milner-White, adapted the form for use in his Chapel. The readings form a progression, beginning with two passages traditionally seen as prophecies of the coming of Christ, and going on through the familiar readings of the Nativity.

Our own service at St. Andrew's School follows this traditional format closely. Since, liturgically speaking, we hold our service in the middle of Advent, there is always a component of the music of this beautiful season.

Note: Immediately after the service, all are invited into the choir for the singing of the Hallelujah Chorus from *Messiah*. Music will be provided.

ALL STANDING, THESE PRAYERS ARE SAID:

Beloved in Christ, be it our care and delight to prepare ourselves to hear again the message of the Angels, and in heart and mind to go to Bethlehem and see the thing which has come to pass.

Therefore let us hear in Holy Scripture the story of the loving promises of God and His glorious Redemption, and let us make this Chapel sound with our carols of praise.

But first, because this of all things would rejoice the heart of our Lord Jesus, let us pray to Him for the needs of the whole world, and all His people; for peace on the earth He came to save; for unity in the Church He founded; and for justice and goodwill amongst all people.

And, particularly at this time, let us remember before Him the poor, the cold, the hungry, the oppressed; the sick and those who mourn; the lonely and the unloved, and all those who do not know or love the Lord Jesus, or who have grieved Him by their sin.

Lastly, let us remember those who have died, the multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom, in this same Lord Jesus, we are one for evermore.

These prayers and praises let us humbly offer up to God in the words that Christ Himself taught us, Saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven . . .
