

MLK Week Events

Next week, we will celebrate Dr. King and civil rights leader Congressman <u>John</u> <u>Lewis</u>. Events will include:

- Monday, January 18 (Martin Luther King, Jr. Day—no classes)
 - All-school screening of <u>John Lewis: Good Trouble</u>, followed by breakout discussion groups and a community reflection
- Wednesday, January 20
 - Screening of the Presidential Inauguration followed by Zoom dropin session
 - MLK Chapel Service featuring Dean of Faculty Professional Development, Dean of Honor, and History Department Chair Emily Pressman
- Friday, January 22
 - All-school Chapel honoring student voices
- Equity & inclusion Lyceum events to be held by faculty, staff, and students throughout the week
- Alumni panel on the life of Trustee Tom Hooper '71, who passed away last month. Mr. Hooper was one of St. Andrew's first students of color, and the school's first Black School President, Alumni Board member, Trustee, and Trustee Emeritus.

March Return-to-School Updates

On Tuesday, Mr. Roach sent a letter to all parents with some initial plans for our March return to school. You can read the letter here. Highlights:

- Students will need to quarantine for at least seven days prior to their arrival on campus.
- We will ask students to arrive on campus with a documented negative COVID-19 test, taken within five days prior to their arrival. For spring arrivals, we will accept a negative test result from either a PCR test or a rapid antigen test.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19 at any point between November 20, 2020 and their return to campus in March, please be sure to contact Director of Health Services Annette Rickolt (arickolt@standrews-de.org), as some additional health paperwork will be required for spring athletics participation.
- We anticipate our teachers and staff members who have daily contact with students will receive at least the first of their two vaccinations in late January or February (contingent upon the continued supply and distribution of the vaccine).
