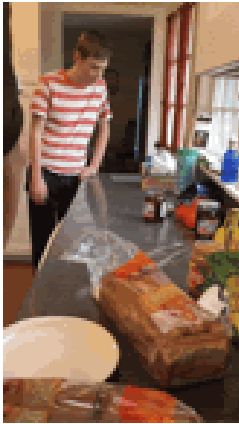

St. Andrew's faculty (and their kids!) have been signing up for weekly "sandwich duty": assembling and delivering 200 PB&J sandwiches to Andrew's Place, a men's transitional shelter in Wilmington, each Friday. As an essential service, Andrew's Place continues to offer emergency services to the homeless during the pandemic, and "we are amazed how the numbers of those in need continue to increase," [writes Friendship House Executive Director Kim Eppheimer](#). "There are little to no options left for those who are experiencing homelessness. Almost every physical door has been closed to them. And, what pains me more, there are no known contingency plans for this group of deeply vulnerable people. They are invisible to so many."
