The December *Cardinal* of 1960 contained an editorial which concerned the hard work and accomplishments of Mr. Reyner in his capacity of Director of Athletics. After reading this editorial, I was left with the feeling that something needs to be said concerning all the coaches and the work they do. The theme is not new, but it is one which needs to be repeated.

Coaching at St. Andrew's is what one would call "low-pressure". The alumni do not send threatening letters, nor does the student body hang coaches in effigy. Moreover, one's salary does not fluctuate with his won-lost percentage. Nevertheless, there is pressure. The pressure is strong, and it can be extremely painful. It is called pride, and without exception, it is instilled in every coach here.

If there is one picture that I will take away from this school, it will be a composite picture of Mr. Reyner at half-time of the Germantown game this year, Mr. Washburn after the first Tower Hill basketball game last year,

and Mr. Colburn after the second Sanford baseball game last year. This picture shows three men at points where they could not take pride in their teams, because in each game, the team had let its coach down. They were hurt.

Coaching here can, at times, be a thankless job, and the St. Andreans owe a debt of gratitude which can never be repayed.

St. Andrew's Win Paced by Dillon

St. Andrew's School of Middletown handed Tatnall School a 35-2 lacing Saturday in the opening game of the baseball season for both teams at Tatnall.

Sandy Dillon paced the attack with two homers, a double and a single, knocking in eight runs. Dave Walker and Curt Coward also hit homers for St. Andrew's, which scored 13 runs in the seventh inning.

St. Andrew's romps, 35 to 0

St. Andrew's School beat host team Tatnall Saturday, 35-0. In football? No. In basketball? No. In baseball? Yes.

It was the opening game for both schools and the boy that powered the lopsided victory was Sandy Dillon who smacked two home runs — one a grand slam — knocked a double and single, also, and drove in eight runs while scoring six times.

Dave Walker and Curt Coward also homered for the winners who came up with 13 runs in the top of the seventh inning.

Varsity Baseballers Set State Record

Wilmington, Del., April 11, 1964—The Varsity baseball team won its opener against Tatnall convincingly 35-2. The weak Tatnall team, which had practiced only twice before the game, and which had lost the league's best pitcher with a shoulder separation, was no match for the powerful Saints.

Tatnall scored first on some opening-day jitters by the Reds. But the Saints came back with a big eight runs in the second inning. The rally was highlighted by a grand slam homer by co-captain Sandy Dillon. The Saints scored another six in the third by homers by Dave Walker and Dillon. Dillon drove in two more runs with a double in the fourth as the Saints scored another six. Coach Colburn substituted freely in order to let everyone play as much as possible. The Saints continued to score on walks and Tatnall miscues. Curt Coward homered in the thirteen-run seventh inning.

Rufus Barrett started and was given credit for the win. Terry Wild and Coward were effective in relief of Barrett.

Coach Bob Colburn of St. Andrew's School came up with this gnawing feeling in the pit of his stomach on opening day when his baseball squad trounced Tatnall, 35-2.

"IT WAS really embarrassing for us," Colburn said. "We had a 16-player squad and used all of them. We started substituting in the third inning. The only ones we left in the game were our co-captains, Sandy Dillon and Dennis Blair.

In all honesty, Colburn said, Tatnall, which doesn't have a gym, didn't get much practice because of the weather compared with the two weeks St. Andrew's got in. "They practiced the morning of the day they played us. They probably were tired and, because they hadn't thrown much like we did, made those bad plays."

THOSE MISCUES, plus about 10 walks and 23 "good hits" led to the lopsided victory. Tatnall also lost four key players from last year's team, including ace Pitcher Steve Lincoln who couldn't play this season because of a football injury to his shoulder.

"I was hoping our players would hit into plays that would be outs, but as a coach I just couldn't tell them to go up there and get out on purpose," Colburn added.

Var. Baseball Overwhelms 'Invincible' Archmere Nine

Middletown, Del., April 18, 1964—The Cardinals, in winning their second game in as many outings, exploded the "Archmere myth" that had plagued so many S.A.S. teams in the past by soundly drubbing the Archers 9-1. The accent in the game for the Saints was defense, as the game was highlighted by fine, heads-up ball, both in the infield and the outfield. Rufus Barrett, the Saints' ace starter, turned in one of the best performances of his career, dazzling the Archers with a fine curve and effective screwball. The only Archmere run scored on a double play attempt that missed by not more than a whisker.

In the first inning the game looked like a typical Archmere-S.A.S. game. Archmere loaded the bases with one out and threatened to break the game wide open before the Saints had a chance to bat. But this game was different. Sophomore shortstop Chip Burton grabbed a sharp grounder, flipped to second sacker Gibb Kane for the force, and Kane relayed to Dave Walker (alias Bunker Hill) at first to complete the double play. The Saints were unable to get anything started in the first inning. On defense in the top of the second, the Big Red came up with their second double play of the game. Rightfielder Al Day snagged a liner and fired to first to catch the Archmere runner, who had broken with the pitch, way off base to complete the double play.

The Saints mounted their first offensive in the bottom of the third. After clean hits by Walker and Burton, and a walk to Max Baldwin, the Archmere pitcher walked pitcher Barrett, forcing in Walker from third

with the first Red run. Then the Archmere leftfielder conveniently flubbed Lee Tawes' liner to let three runs across. Catcher, co-captain Dennis Blair slammed a single up the middle to score Tawes from third.

Archmere scored their lone run in the fourth on the aforementioned double play attempt.

The Saints came roaring back in their half of the fourth with four more big runs. Walker led off with a single, and Burton sent him to third with a double to center. Then Day drove in Hill with a sacrifice fly to center. Kane singled, and Baldwin slammed a triple in between the center and rightfielder to drive in two more. Barrett drove in Baldwin from third with a single.

The Saints' defense played tight baseball for the remainder of the game and Barrett continued to baffle the entire Archmere lineup with superb control. The defensive play of the game came in the third inning when, after a sharp single off the glove of Walker, Archmere's Boland broke for the plate. Walker retrieved the ball in shallow right and fired a perfect shot to Blair at home who tagged the sliding giant out in a dramatic cloud of dust.

In the first inning Chip Burton got on base by virtue of a passed ball. He then stole second, went to third on another passed ball, and scored when Sandy Dillon's grounder to short was misplayed. Dillon proceeded to steal second and third, and scored on Dennis Blair's well-placed single.

In the third inning, Curt Coward raced to first on an error. His great speed enabled him to reach third on Danny Moore's shot past first. Coward scored when Lee Taves singled the first of his two safeties.

The crowd came to life when Rufus Barrett poled a long blast to deep left center which went for a double. Ordinarily, Barrett might have had another base, but Sanford's outfield was playing for his Ruth-like power.

The highlight of the game, however, was the pitching. Sanford's Craig Boyd looked strong in giving up but six hits and three runs. The Saints' Curt Coward proved stronger in blanking the Warriors on two hits, and fanning eleven while walking only one.

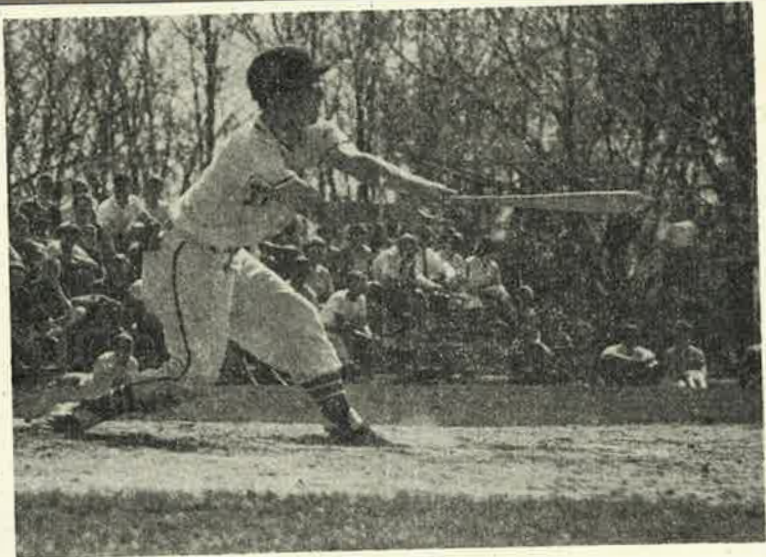

Westtown Upsets Baseball In Twelve

Westtown, Pa., April 25, 1964—St. Andrew's Varsity Baseball Team lost their first game of the season to Westtown, 7-6, in a twelve inning marathon. After a scoreless first inning, Westtown jumped on starter Tom Lackey for four runs in the top of the second. The Westtown pitcher was extremely effective in the early innings, for the Saints were not able to put a man on base until Dennis Blair doubled in the fourth. Dillon then singled and stole second. Blair rode home with the Saints' first run on Burton's sacrifice to right.

In the fifth, Max Baldwin singled, stole second, and scored when Blair's hit to the infield was misplayed. Rufus Barrett, who had relieved Lackey in the third, continued to handcuff the Westtown hitters, as the Reds found themselves down by 4-2, in the top of the seventh. Curt Coward batted for Al Day and drilled a single to left. Moore then ran for Coward. Baldwin singled and Barrett moved the runners up with a fine sacrifice. Dennis Blair then lined a single to left, scoring Baldwin and Moore for the tying runs.

Neither team scored until the top of the tenth inning. In the Red half of the tenth, Tawes reached first on an error and Blair singled, moving Tawes to third. Blair stole second, and Tawes then scored on a fielder's choice, while Blair moved to third. Blair then scored on a sacrifice fly by Kane. The Saints took a 6-4 lead into the bottom of the tenth.

Barrett, tiring after having already pitched more than a regulation game, hit one batter and walked another. Then with two outs, the Westtown right fielder clouted a long double to left-center and tied the score once more at 6-6.

The Cardinals were unable to mount an offensive play in the eleventh or twelfth, and in the bottom of the twelfth, Barrett, beginning his tenth inning of pitching, yielded three straight hits and Westtown scored the winning run.

High Neighbors

Coward buoys nine

St. Andrew's School's baseball team is one of those opportunist aggregations.

"We're not a real powerful club," Coach Bob Colburn said. "We score a lot on errors, walks and hits. Just about any way there is to score."

"LATELY WE'VE been just taking advantage of breaks. The hitting hasn't been outstanding."

The Saints, however, have won their last four games and are in first place in the Independent Conference with a 6-1 record. Overall, Colburn's crew is 7-1, losing only to Archmere, 9-1.

One of the big reasons for the Saints' success is Curt Coward, a 6-foot-2, 175-pounder who has a 4-0 record,

0.40 earned run average—and is Colburn's top pinch hitter.

Coward's most impressive performance came last Saturday when St. Andrew's beat conference foe St. Elizabeth's twice, and Coward won both games in relief, going four innings the first game and three the second.

IN THE SECOND game, however, Coward came closer to losing his first game than he has all season.

The score was tied 2-2 in the eighth inning with St. Andrew's the visiting team. There were runners on first and third for the Vikings with one out. The next batter popped up a bunt for two outs, but Coward hit the next batter to load the bases.

The tall senior then ran the

count to 3 and 2 on the following batter — and then threw five pitches before striking him out. St. Andrew's won it in the 11th, 3-2.

AND TWO DAYS before that, he went seven innings to beat Friends, 9-2.

Rufus Barrett, who also plays second base, is the other pitcher Colburn counts on a lot. Barrett is 2-1 and has a 1.67 ERA. Although Coward hasn't been up as much as the other top hitters on the club, he leads the team with a .500 average, 6-for-12. In addition to him, four others are batting over .300—Leftfielder Max Baldwin (.465), Barrett (.388), third baseman Lee Tawes (.354), and catcher Dennis Blair (.303).

Tawes and center fielder

Sandy Dillon lead the team in runs batted in with 14 and 12 respectively, "although Coward has delivered a lot of key hits," Colburn said.

"And he's averaging a strikeout per inning, 18 in 18 innings."

Dave Smith of Friends School is another hot item in the Independent Conference. In five games, the Quaker ace has a 4-1 record, including a 3-0, no-hitter over Westtown and two other shutouts.

ALL TOLD, he has pitched 32 2/3 innings, giving up 9 hits and 5 runs, has struck out 40, walked 10 and has an ERA of 0.64.

He's no piker at the plate either, compiling a .371 average and leading the team in runs batted in with 16.

St. Andrew Gains Lead In League

Friends' Victory Ends 12-1 Season

Alapocas, Wilmington, Delaware, May 25, 1964—The Varsity Baseball team proved that it deserved to be first in the Independent Conference and that it is one of the best teams in Delaware by coming from behind in the seventh inning to whip Friends 8-2. The Saints finished the most successful season in St. Andrew's baseball history with a 12-1 record, winning their last nine games in a row, and losing only to Westtown 7-6 in a 12 inning marathon back on April 25.

The Saints were handcuffed for the first four innings by the Friends' starter, Dave Smith, who had a perfect game going until Dave Walker singled cleanly to lead off the fifth. Chip "The Rookie" Burton followed with another sharp single. Gibby Kane moved the runners up with a perfect sacrifice bunt, and then Ory Taves, batting for Al Day, slammed a grounder at the first baseman, who misplayed it, allowing Walker to score the tying run. Friends had scored in the first on an infield error, a single, and a very close play at second.

Friends went ahead again in the bottom of the sixth on a two-base throwing error and a single.

Things looked pretty bleak for the Reds, behind 2-1 with one out in the top of the seventh, but then the rally started. Burton started things off by booming a triple to deep center. Kane then rammed a swinging bunt through the Friends' drawn up infield to score Burton with the tying run. Pitcher Coward then singled to left, moving Kane to third. Danny Moore put down a fine bunt single to third, scoring Kane with the go-ahead run. Baldwin then singled the fast-moving Coward in from second. Wild Overcomes Polio, Becomes St. Andrew Ace

As a grade-school youngster, Terry Wild shagged fly balls for Ruly Carpenter, Pat Williams and others on Tower Hill School's baseball team.

During the football season, he closely observed Tower Hill's football games from the stands and watched his brother Jimmy develop into an All-State full-back.

Sports was a big topic at home, too. His father, Bill, was a former Lafayette College athlete, coached basketball at Tower Hill and has continued to be a teacher there.

Terry loved athletics, wanted so much to be an athlete. But he had one big problem—polio.

Now a senior at St. Andrew's School, and in spite of a withered right leg stemming from the polio, young Wild has become an athlete. An outstanding one, too.

A left-handed pitcher, he's the ace of the St. Andrew's staff. He has won six games and lost two, accounting for every one of the Saints' victories to date. The losses were to Friends by 2-1 in his first start of the year and to Westtown Friends, Independent Conference leader, by 6-5 in 10 innings last Saturday.

WILD, 5-foot-11 and 150 pounds, is one of only two pitchers to have beaten Westtown this season. He did it with a four-hitter, fanning 10 and walking two. Last Saturday, he lost to Westtown when a dropped fly ball allowed the winning run. Terry tossed an eight-hitter in that game, struck out 11 and issued two passes.

"I'd hate to think where we'd be without Terry," says Bob Colburn, St. Andrew's coach. "We count on him as our bread and butter."

"He's worked hard to overcome the handicap. He has wonderful equipment, a good

fastball and good breaking stuff. "HE has one of the most cheerful spirits of any boy in the school. And it's contagious. He does every drill every other boy has to do, even though

it may take him a little longer. He's an example to other boys on the team who tend to take it easy. He's a terrific influence in that respect."

Terry has achieved pitching success although his fielding range is limited. For this reason, St. Andrew's sets up its infield defense differently when Wild is working. However, Colburn pointed out that the Wilmington youth is "a very sure fielder on balls hit back at him."

Do rival teams try to take advantage of his disability by bunting?

"NO," replied Colburn. "In fact, I think we've seen less bunting this year than we have in other years."

What type of hitter is Wild? "He's not hitting much for average, but he hits a long ball."

Wild must hit the ball a long way to get on base as he can hobble only to the bag.

Terry was on the baseball team last year, but pitched only 15 innings. With the graduation of three veteran pitchers last spring, St. Andrew's badly needed a first-rate flinger this season and Wild has filled that gap superbly.

WILD was struck by polio when 18 months old. He since has undergone surgery at Alfred I. du Pont Institute several times, once to build an artificial ankle, and another time on both legs to balance the growth. He also wore braces for many years.

St. Andrew's, with a 6-3 record, is in the running for the conference pennant. Terry hopes he can contribute more toward achieving that goal.

Wild has enrolled at Lycoming College and plans, with the same indomitable spirit, to continue his athletic career there.

Russell Perry will catch for Hukill, while Scott Miller is leading infield reserve. Defending conference champs don't have as much speed as usual: "When we won the league three years ago, we stole everything in sight," reminisces Tattersall. "It seems on the surface we have a lot of hitting; the question mark will

be how the new players handle the pitching."

"Sippelle was an All-Con-

Tip Tribbett of Middletown is the frontrunner in Flight B, while also being tied for fourth in the state a .478 mark.

Bruce Abbott just missed breaking into the top 20 list in the state, but the St. Andrew's star leads everyone in three categories. Abbott has rapped 22 hits, four more than Fagan, Turner and Gise, and has driven in 21 runs, six more than his closest contender. He has also batted 53 times, explaining his "low," .415 average.
