Friends, St. Andrew's and Sanford each put one on the squad, which was picked by the five coaches on an all-opponent basis. The lineup:

Pitcher — James Krewatch, junior, Tower Hill.

Catcher — John Glodek, junior, Archmere.

First base — David Possinger, junior, Sanford.

Second base — Richard Hill, senior, Friends.

Third base — Joseph Lo Biondo, sophomore, Archmere.

Shortstop — James Kramer, junior, Tower Hill.

Left field — Kenneth McCullough, senior, St. Andrew's.

Center field — James Lanahan, senior, Archmere.

Right field — Robert Bird, junior, Tower Hill.

For the second consecutive season Krewatch was the ace of the Tower Hill pitching corps. He won eight of 10 overall games and was the main reason the Hillers threatened Archmere for the conference championship late in the season.

KREWATCH, who was mentioned on every ballot, worked 70 1-3 innings, allowing only 44 hits and 10 earned runs for an earned-run average of 0.99. He struck out 80 and walked 16.

Krewatch is vice president of the Tower Hill student council and captain-elect of the baseball team. This summer he will study in Turkey as a part of the American Field Service program.

POSSINGER also did some pitching, winning three of four conference games for Sanford and was among the leaders in strikeouts. Possinger hit .276, driving in winning runs in two games. At Sanford's all-sports banquet recently, he was named the most valuable player.

Glodek was a starter for the Vince Filliben Archers as a sophomore. The Chester, Pa., resident hit .301 in conference competition and received much praise for his handling of the pitchers. He led the team in driving in runs.

Lo Biondo, of Bridgeton, N. J., broke into the starting lineup this season as a sophomore. Lo Biondo was second to Glodek in RBI's and had a .250 batting average in eight league games.

LANAHAN, from Wallingford, Pa., led Archmere in hitting with a .360 mark and also in stolen bases. He had five assists from center field.

Bird's .319 average was tops on the Tower Hill squad. Added to that was leadership in runs batted in, total bases and total hits. Coach Ernie Savage considers Bird's throwing arm one of the strongest in the conference.
