## Baseball's Colburns: Like father, like son

Staff reporter Bruce Colburn, a 1982 graduate of St. Andrew's School in Middletown, still has a long way to go to equal the baseball talents of his father, Robert Colburn, at Haver-

ford College in Pennsylvania.

But the son, a 6-foot, 155-pound sophomore pitcher for the Fords, now has something in common with his father, who is the athletic director and head coach in baseball and football at St. Andrew's.

They were on the only teams that defeated St. Joseph's University in games 25 years apart. When the Fords won 8-7 in

March, it marked the first time they had beaten the Hawks since the spring of 1959.

Bruce is a varsity roster player this season, although pitching pri-

marily for the junior varsity.

The father, a three-year varsity third baseman, led the 1959 Haverford team in RBI (12), while compiling a .290 batting average. His efforts helped the Fords post a 7-4 record, which included two wins over St. Joe's.

But the senior Colburn, a chemistry teacher at St. Andrew's, couldn't remember what he did against the Hawks 25 years ago. He did remember that the team's greatest satisfaction that season

was derived not from the wins over the Hawks but a victory over Swarthmore College. "Haverford vs. Swarthmore was a big rivalry and had more importance," he explained. "We had lost to Swarthmore the three previous years.

Colburn remembered one of the highlights of his college baseball career, against Ursinus College when he was a junior.

"Big league scouts were at the game to scout Ursinus' third baseman, Bob Famous," he recalled. "But I kinda stole his thunder that day. I went 3-for-4 at bat. Our team had a total of only five hits."

Colburn also was a varsity football player for two years at Haverford, playing quarterback and

safety.
At St. Andrew's, he coached his son in baseball two years.

Bruce was a shortstop/first

baseman at St. Andrew's, where he also was a three-year varsity soccer player, a member of the school's only state championship team, in 1981.

"With more work and experience, Bruce will be able to help our pitching staff in the near future," said Greg Kannerstein, Haverford's baseball coach and athletic director. "He'll certainly help prevent another Haverford drought against the Hawks.'
